

Mental Health Diagnoses

- 52% Anxiety Disorders and PTSD
- 27% Bi Polar Disorders
- 29% Depressive Disorders
- 20% Schizophrenia and Related Disorders
- 7% Phobias
- 10% Other Disorders
- 25% Personality Disorders

Substance Diagnoses

- 44% Alcohol Use Disorders
- 29% Marijuana Use Disorders
- ▶ 18% Methamphetamine Use Disorders
- 14% Cocaine Use Disorders
- 7% Opiates and Sedative Use Disorders




Outpatient: Access to Resources






Outpatient: Homelessness






Outpatient: Higher Levels of Care





Outpatient: Leaders in treating addiction and mental illness Types of Care Received















Residential Treatment Completion Rates




Residential Follow Up After Services






PIER ACT Team-Hospital



Most recent data collected indicates clients were hospitalized for 8,603 days in the year prior to their admission to PIER.













Residential Utilization






Cost Per Unit vs Reimbursement
