




GENDER





I HAVE MORE COURAGE ALEX – A SUCCESS STORY

“I had lived with depression and other symptoms of poor mental health since childhood and had unreasonable expectations of what a good life meant and the work it took to get there. I was very ashamed and desperate for a better life. For my reentry back into the community from the Regional Center, I was referred to CenterPointe.

At CenterPointe I received a housing voucher, medication management, an individual counselor, caseworkers, and attended the day rehabilitation program. It took time and CenterPointe stuck with me.

It wasn't until I began working with a CenterPointe Peer Support Specialist that I could break down my unrealistic expectations and appreciate my reality. From there, I made better use of my resources and worked towards independence by taking small steps.”

Alex went on to become a Certified Peer Specialist himself and now helps to lead the Wellbeing Initiative Warm Line, Wellbeing Connections. Alex has committed himself to providing a reassuring voice for anyone feeling overwhelmed and to remind others they are not alone.


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
